



Dear Colleagues,

The cardiopulmonary system is at the very core of our daily practice. Indeed, there are constant improvements in technology and technique that can impact our daily performance of all cases, not just cardiac and thoracic. For our Minnesota Society of Anesthesiologists Fall Meeting on November 12th, we have a full morning program of speakers discussing innovative topics regarding the cardiopulmonary system. In the afternoon, we have heard the requests for more education in ultrasound guided regional anesthesia, and will have a four station interactive workshop on ultrasound for truncal blocks.

Our full slate of speakers on the cardiopulmonary system includes Dr. Trevor Lee, an innovator and expert in high spinal anesthesia for cardiac surgery – a cutting edge and thought provoking topic that is sure to generate interest and discussion. Our second guest lecturer, Dr. Matteo Parotto, will update us regarding optimal ventilation strategies in the operating room. Both of our local speakers will be discussing technologies that have become more widely used in recent years. Dr. Daniela Orza will detail the anesthetic management for transcatheter aortic valve replacement, and Dr. David Barbara will provide guidance on the anesthetic management of patients with ventricular assist devices for noncardiac surgery.

After a refreshing lunch with plenty of opportunity to network with colleagues and interact with exhibitors, we will hold a workshop on ultrasound for truncal anesthesia. Specific techniques will include Pecs 1/2/3, quadratus lumborum, transversalis fascia plane (TFP), traditional/subcostal TAP, rectus sheath, and neuraxial scanning. Four stations of hands-on scanning led by Drs. Jake Hutchins, Adam Amundson, Roberto Blanco, and Emily Sharpe will provide excellent opportunities for honing regional anesthesia skills. As always, the Fall Meeting is sure to be an educational and enjoyable day. I hope you will attend!

### Meeting Faculty



David Barbara, MD Assistant Professor of Anesthesiology Mayo Clinic

Dr. David Barbara completed Anesthesiology residency followed by Cardiovascular Anesthesiology and Critical Care Medicine fellowships at Mayo Clinic. He is an Assistant Professor of Anesthesiology, cardiac anesthesiologist, and intensivist at Mayo Clinic, Rochester, MN and divides his clinical practice between the cardiac surgery operating rooms and cardiac surgery intensive care units. With over 40 peer reviewed publications and several book chapters, his research and teaching interests include the perioperative management of LVAD patients. First author publications and abstracts include some of the recent studies on modern generation LVAD patients undergoing various noncardiac operations and procedures. He has spoken nationally and internationally on the topic of perioperative management of the LVAD patient undergoing noncardiac surgery and enjoys teaching noncardiac anesthesiologists about this exciting and highly clinically-relevant topic.



Trevor Lee, MD, FRCPC, FAAPL, CCPE Associate Professor of Anesthesiology University of Manitoba

Dr. Lee graduated from medicine and completed his Anesthesia residency at the University of Manitoba. He obtained further advanced clinical training in Cardiac Anesthesiology, Heart-Lung Transplantation and Cardiac ICU at Papworth Hospital (University of Cambridge, England) and also in Perioperative Transesophageal Echocardiography at St. Michael's Hospital (Toronto, Ontario). He is a Fellow of the American Society of Echocardiography, a Fellow of the Royal Society of Medicine, and also a Fellow of the American Association of Physician Leaders. With a longstanding interest in patient safety, medical administration, and health policy, Dr. Lee recently graduated with a Master's of Medical Management degree from Carnegie Mellon University.

Dr. Lee is currently an Associate Professor of Anesthesia, and a member of the Section of Cardiac Anesthesia at St. Boniface Hospital in Winnipeg, Manitoba and holds an administrative position as the Chief Medical Information Officer for the Province of Manitoba. Research interests include high spinal anesthesia for cardiac surgery, perioperative delirium, and organ donor preservation techniques for cardiac transplantation.
